LPRD PROGRESS REPORT : EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overview

The Libyan Programme for Reintegration and Development (LPRD), formerly known as The Warriors Affairs Commission, was established in 2011 following the revolution to free Libya. The LPRD's mission is to achieve the reintegration of beneficiaries through a series of DDR and awareness programmes to contribute to the rebuilding and prosperity of Libya. Over the last 3 years the team has developed an efficient organisation that has been able to establish 31 branch centres nationwide and interview and register 162,000 individuals onto a single database. Today the organisation is ready to support a unity government in bringing peace and prosperity to Libya.

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Programmes and Partners

The organisation has started an ambitious programme of reintegration, training and development. This work includes providing psychological counselling to treat issues such as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, providing awareness and orientation training to 60,000 participants, English language training, business skills and basic computing skills development, and 5,000 scholarships; all to help develop participants become effective contributors to the rebuilding of a new Libya. The programme has created opportunities such as training for diplomatic roles, and establishing SMEs; and has also integrated over 5,000 fighters into the Libyan security forces.

Over the last three years the organisation has worked with a wide range of partners both within the Libyan government as well as internationally.

Achievements

The LPRD has achieved all of this in three years with 69 million Libyan Dinar (\$45M USD, 0.09% of the government's national budget); and has secured and committed a further 118 million Libyan Dinar (\$80M USD) over the next two years in order to scale up the projects and reach more of the registered participants. As a government organisation, the LPRD is audited annually by the Libyan Audit Bureau and provides routine financial reporting to the Office of the Prime Minister ensuring complete transparency. Having signed an agreement with the Libyan organisation for Anti-Corruption and Transparency, the LPRD is open to an independent audit without prior notice. To date the LPRD has been able to demonstrate responsible and fully accountable financial accounts further highlighting the commitment the organisation has to supporting a unified, free and prosperous Libya.

The LPRD has managed to achieve a number of notable firsts in Libya. It is the first organisation to mandate the use of the national identity number to access services; the first organisation to establish a comprehensive database of both its staff and participants; and the first organisation to be fully open to an independent audit.

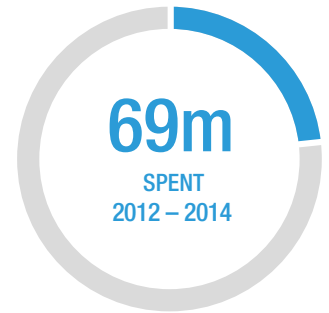

187,989,000 LD

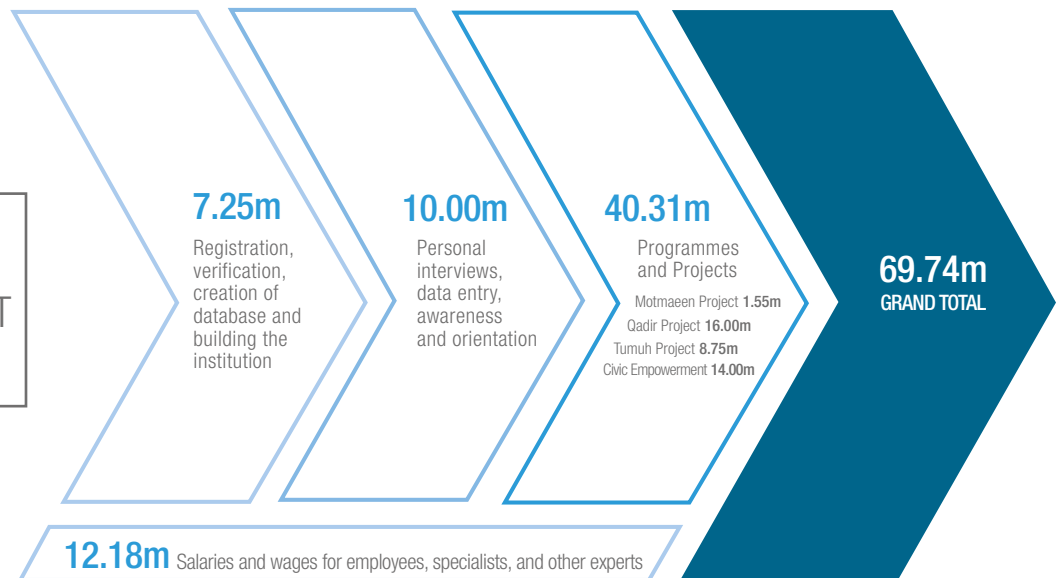


Amount to be spent on
